●●● 211 Ontario

211 is a free, 24/7 information and referral source. Both the phone line (2-1-1) and website (211 ontario.ca) provide information on community, social, government, health and wellbeing services.

●●● GenNEXT

Young professionals develop leadership skills, make connections and give back to their community in a variety of ways, such as Tampon Tuesday events.

●●● Supplies 4 Students

A collaborative program to ensure that Oxford families facing financial hardships have the ability to provide school supplies for their children to help them be ready and equipped to learn.

●●● Youth United Council Investments

Council Members develop and learn about community needs, impact and measurement. Through their granting stream they invest in applications for projects designed for youth and by youth.
