A PATH TO SAFETY, STABILITY, AND SUPPORT

I'm in my sixties and I never thought I would be at risk of losing my home due to my mental health challenges and financial struggles. With support from my housing worker, I stayed connected to care and received help managing my finances through the Public Guardian and Trustee, which brought me hope and relief. I was then supported in applying to a retirement home where I now live in a safe, supportive environment with meals and help with my medications. Since moving in, I've built new friendships and found the safety and connection I needed.

No one should have to choose between healthy food, safe shelter, or basic needs. In Oxford County, many of our community members face these tough choices, especially those living in poverty. United Way Oxford helps people build financial stability by securing safe, affordable housing and developing skills for a brighter future.

- 2,259,423 meals and/or snacks were provided to help those living with food insecurity.
- **226 people** at risk of homelessness found support.
- 44 people who were once homeless across Oxford County have now secured long-term housing.

Everyone deserves to feel included, supported, and mentally well, regardless of age, background, or life experience. Yet many people in Oxford County struggle with connecting to the support they need to be well. United Way Oxford funds programs locally to connect people with resources that build resilience, improve well-being, and foster lasting belonging.

- 778 moments of care and healing through sexual assault counselling took place in Oxford County.
- **404 people** received the mental health support they needed.
- 235 individuals 55+ were served by a United Way-funded program.
